

# FAIR WORK HEARING *POSTPONED*

## RALLY FOR AIRPORT WORKERS ON HOLD – FOR NOW

The Fair Work Commission has put back a hearing set for Thursday April 6th on whether to give the go-ahead for a new company to bring in slave-like conditions for airport workers.

This means we're holding off on a rally in Melbourne – for now. But we're planning an even bigger protest in the coming months – to send a loud and clear message to aviation bosses that we won't accept a race to the bottom.



### WHAT'S AT STAKE

Dnata's Airport Handling Services Australia wants to bring in low wages and split shifts. The Commission will hear this application on May 15th – the TWU will be opposing it. If successful all aviation companies will be demanding that workers accept the same conditions just to keep their job.

We've already had some success. Altara's Aviation Ground Resources filed an agreement with similar poor conditions but withdrew it just this week.
