

TOLL/ALLEGRO BARGAINING UPDATE



With the sale of Toll's Global Express division to Allegro now taking effect, the TWU has moved swiftly to ensure negotiations for a new agreement for both Toll and Allegro don't stall.

Off the back of historic nationwide industrial action, Toll has finally signed a transfer deed, so that the current pay and conditions of all Toll employees transferring to Allegro have been protected. Likewise, contracts of owner drivers will be protected and assigned across to Allegro. For too long Toll refused to sign such a deed, but you have shown that you will fight for your conditions.

Senior TWU officials have now met with Allegro senior management. As a result, Allegro has agreed to continue negotiations and to pursue a working relationship with the TWU.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

- > Allegro management will meet with the delegate-led bargaining team on **Wednesday 8 September**. We'll report back to you on the outcomes.
- > Negotiations with Toll will also continue, with the next meeting to be held **Thursday 9 September**. Updates to follow.
