

# CAN'T RELY ON BANKS TO FUND FAIR CONTRACTS



Given the high level of uncertainty, the TWU has no choice but to take action, using the newly won transport reform laws to **enforce workers' rights through a Contract Chain Order.**

## USING LAWS WON BY TWU MEMBERS

- With these laws, the TWU has **forced banks and retailers into urgent meetings with the Fair Work Commission (FWC)** to discuss the future of the cash in transit industry. So far, three conferences have been held, with the latest taking place on 19 March.
- These new laws ensure that the **TWU and workers have seats at the table** with the economic employers to secure fair contracts that provide job security, safety, fair wages, and decent working conditions.

**Banks have repeatedly proven that they cannot be relied on to act in the best interests of workers. Cash-in-transit workers are not bargaining chips to be used at the whim of these financial giants.**

## WHAT ARE TWU MEMBERS ARE ASKING FOR?

- ▶ **TWU members demand** fair rates of pay, guaranteed minimum standards, proper training, safety measures, and updated equipment to do their jobs.
- ▶ The TWU has asked that the **FWC urgently hear our case.** The banks and retailers have until 31 March to confirm their positions and we will have a further update after that.
- ▶ In the meantime, **we have written to Armaguard** demanding they recommence bargaining meetings immediately.
