Hundreds of TWU aviation workers protested Swissport's operations in airports right across the country, calling out:

- ⚠ Dangerous safety standards
- ⚠ Chronic understaffing
- ⚠ Race-to-the-bottom business model Swissport relies on

### ROSTER DISPUTE FILED IN THE FAIR WORK COMMISSION

We've lodged a formal dispute in the Fair Work Commission over Swissport's failure to provide rosters with enough notice - a clear breach of the Enterprise Agreement.

### APRIL: THE BOOTS FIGHT

Swissport, a rich multinational corporation, is making minimum-wage workers to pay for their own safety boots. This is unlawful under WHS/OHS legislation. The TWU is demanding:

- Reimbursement for workers who have already paid
- Immediate compliance with the law going forward
