

TWU takes on Swissport over rostering practices

TWU members are escalating a major Swissport campaign regarding the company's non-compliant rostering practice. We have taken the matter up with the Fair Work Commission and are seeking a resolution once and for all.

Swissport is on notice

Members have been loud and clear about what Swissport is up to:

- Workers are not receiving their shifts within the required notice period
- Worker's shifts are being changed last minute and without notice or without consultation

These are direct violations of Swissport's Enterprise Agreement.

The TWU has been trying to resolve this dispute with Swissport management for months now, to no avail. Short-notice roster publications and changes are unfair and deeply frustrating, creating constant uncertainty and making it impossible to plan our lives. Enough is enough.

Next steps

There will be a listing in the Fair Work Commission on the **4 May**.
