TWU member-led committee with delegates from across Australia

Your TWU member-led bargaining team met with TGE management to begin negotiations for a new national Enterprise Agreement. We presented your log of claims formulated by members.

LOG OF CLAIMS TABLED WITH TGE

TGE were put on notice by the TWU member-led delegate committee during the first round of negotiations on 28 and 29 April 2026 with a worker log of claims focussed on job-security.

🎯 **Job Security** is a major focus with a big suite of claims to protect employees

🎯 **Wage Claim** that seeks real growth in current global economic environment

🎯 **New Tech Controls** to ensure that worker interests are front and centre

🎯 **National Owner Driver Agreement** requirements to benefit all TGE workers

YOUR TWU CLAIMS

- **2029 Alignment** — Expiry for June 2029 to align and maximise power across industry.
- **Fair Pay** — Increases to keep up with cost of living in a difficult economic environment.
- **Industry Standards & Co-operation** — TGE to continue working with the TWU to end the race to the bottom, lift industry standards and make clients pay.

- **Future of Work** — Real worker control over AI, automation and Net Zero to protect jobs, skills and ensure we share in benefits.
- **Job Security** — Set of claims to ensure the full utilisation of permanents, stronger employee ratios, regulation of other forms of work and improved conversion rights.
- **Leave & Conditions** — Stronger leave entitlements including improved parental, cultural, domestic violence, Women's advocate program and mental health training.
