JOB SECURITY ✦ SECURE HOURS ✦ FULL-TIME JOBS

NATIONAL SWISSPORT BLITZ 11 – 22 MAY 2026

Swissport workers across the country are coming together to demand secure hours and secure, full-time jobs.

For too long, Swissport has relied on insecure part-time contracts while expecting workers to do full-time work.

This blitz is about collective action to force change.

WHAT WE'RE DEMANDING

- 1 Increase contracted hours** for workers who are regularly working hours equivalent to full-time employment
- 2 Establish a transparent and fair Expression of Interest (EOI) process** for workers seeking conversion to full-time employment
- 3 Commit to secure, permanent, full-time jobs** where work is regular, systematic, and ongoing

WHY THIS MATTERS

99% of Swissport ground handling workers are employed as part-time

60% or more regularly work full-time hours or the equivalent

Workers don't get paid overtime for hours worked beyond their contracts

There is no pathway in the Agreement to convert to full-time – even after long-term, regular full-time work

Swissport clearly relies on full-time labour, but denies workers secure contracts

In February, **400+ Swissport workers** signed the TWU pledge calling for secure work and secure hours

WHAT'LL HAPPEN DURING THE BLITZ?

- ✦ Organisers & delegates will be on site at key airports.
- ✦ Workers will be asked to sign + vote up an airport-wide resolution calling for secure hours & full-time jobs. Your name will NOT be given to Swissport.
- ✦ Group photos will be taken to show collective support.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT

- ✦ All signed workplace resolutions will be published nationally, and formally served on Swissport.
- ✦ This sends a clear message: Swissport workers are organised, united, and demanding secure jobs.
