TWU Calls for Full Investigation and Prosecution of Cleanaway

The TWU is calling on Comcare to conduct a full investigation and prosecute Cleanaway following a shocking incident in which a worker suffered permanent vision loss after exposure to toxic chemicals.

No worker should suffer a life-changing injury simply for going to work. Every employer has a legal duty to provide a safe workplace, and when they fail, they must be held accountable.

This is not an isolated incident. Five Cleanaway workers have been killed in the past two years, and eight workers have lost their lives since 2022.

Despite this appalling safety record, Cleanaway CEO Mark Schubert received \$4.2 million last financial year, even after his bonus was docked.
