

NEGOTIATIONS UPDATE #3

PROGRESS MADE BUT

CEVA MUST DO BETTER



Your TWU member-led bargaining team met with Ceva for the third round of bargaining. Some claims have advanced, but **core claims remain NOT AGREED**.

YOUR KEY CLAIMS

- ✓ 2029 expiry
- ✓ Line Haul drivers to be covered by agreement
- ✓ Agency Casuals are included in the ratio, TWU has power to oversee worker numbers
- ✓ 20 days paid Family & Domestic Violence Leave
- ✗ Ceva's refusing to join industry fight, no campaign delegates leave to organise undercutters
- ✗ Casual Conversion improvements

✗ CEVA'S WAGE OFFER DOESN'T MEET YOUR CLAIM:

2027: 4% 2028: 3.5% 2029: 3.5%

- **Does not include uncapped CPI protection*
- **Wage increases will be delayed until 2027**, leaving Ceva workers behind other major transport companies
- **No Productivity Training allowance**, meaning you're \$1300 per year worse off
- ✗ Consultation and Dispute Resolution

We know there is a crisis in transport.

- Ceva say that they can stand alone. But we know that workers will only **lift conditions** and **protect jobs and safety** by *fighting together*.
- Ceva must **make a wage offer** that closes the gap with other major transport companies, and they must **join the industry fight**.

Ceva are losing contracts to companies that undercut them and threaten your job security.
The TWU has a plan to tackle this but Ceva refuse to get on board.

NEXT STEPS

- ▶ **Attend yard meetings and have your say:** Your organisers and delegates will be out on-site to discuss your log of claims with you.
- ▶ **Sign a pledge card** to update your details with the TWU and send a strong message to Ceva that they need to be better.
